95/100

Complex aromas of tobacco, cedar and crushed flowers with hints of fruit. Full-bodied, with supersilky tannins and a seductive, subtle finish that lasts for minutes. Like a fine piece of Regency furniture. This is real Brunello. A tiny new producer. Wow. 375 cases made. (JS)



Brunello di Montalcino vintage 2000

92/100

Beautiful aromas of blackberry, cherry and toasty cedar follow through to a full-bodied palate, with ultra-silky tannins and a long, long finish. All in harmony. Really fine for the vintage. Best from 2006 through 2010. 330 cases made.



Brunello di Montalcino vintage 2001

95/100

This is really serious, with a wonderful complexity of ripe fruit, licorice and cedar. Full-bodied, with ultrafine tannins and a long finish. Wood is dominating for now. One of the new garage wines in the region. Best after 2010. 330 cases made.



Brunello di Montalcino vintage 2002

87/100

A pretty red for current drinking, with plum and cherry character, a medium body and a silky texture. Very good for the vintage. Drink now. 330 cases made. –JS



Brunello di Montalcino vintage 2003

88/100

Cedar, tobacco and plum aromas follow through to a full body, with chewy tannins and a medium finish. Slightly over extracted, but rich and impressive. Best after 2010. 330 cases made.
